

ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING AND PARENT ROOM VISITS AUG. 17TH 6:00 IN THE GYM ECPS is a Title I school and participates in a schoolwide program (SWP). Title I funds provide supplemental support to educators in improving the academic achievement of students. The primary goal of a SWP is to ensure that all students, particularly those who are low achieving, demonstrate proficient and advanced levels of achievement on state academic standards.

We will share information about our Title I program. Immediately following the Title I meeting, parents will visit classrooms and teachers will share academic expectations and other information.





K-2 GRADE ASSESSMENTS

ACADIENCE and MAP are administered at the beginning, middle and end of the year.

What is Acadience?

Measures that help teachers and schools determine how students are performing on important reading skills.

What skills are measured by Acadience and why are they important?
The critical skills necessary for successful beginning reading include: phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. Acadience assesses students on four of these five critical skills, which are often referred to as the "Big Ideas" of reading.

How often are students assessed?

All students are given the test three times each year; usually this occurs in the fall, winter, and spring. This school-wide testing is called benchmark assessment.

Teachers may also regularly check on the progress of students who receive extra reading help to make sure their reading skills are improving. These regular checks are called progress monitoring.

What is MAP?

Measure of Academic Progress, MAP, or the Measure of Academic Progress, is a computerized adaptive test which helps teachers, parents, and administrators improve learning for all students and make informed decisions to promote a child's academic growth.
