


**IT Professional Day**



Here are some benefits for reading every day.

- Builds vocabulary
- Improved comprehension
- Improved fluency
- Exercises your brain
- Stimulates your imagination
- Teaches children about the world around them
- Helps to develop empathy
- Provides entertainment
- Calms the mind

Here's how you can help your child.

- Set aside a time to read with and/or to your child (at least 15 minutes).
- Model the importance of reading.
- Ask questions before, during, and after reading.
- Read aloud to your child.
- Help your child decode unknown words.
- Practice using context clues to determine the meaning of unknown words.
